HOW WE DID IT: When Planning Becomes Leading

Emerging from an exciting – but physically distant – summer of Zoom classes and YouTube videos in September 2020, Birch Creek leaders and Program directors were determined to make in-person learning and concerts a reality for 2021. Our plans included writing new policies, reducing enrollment to promote social distancing, installing shade sails for outdoor concerts, painting benches, and having a nurse on campus every weekday. It was a summer of new challenges, followed by enormous successes.

Shade sails were installed and Birch Creek's familiar benches received a fresh coat of paint in time for Opening Night on June 17. On stormy nights, **summer interns** lowered the sails and concerts moved inside the Dutton Concert Barn.

And you came! Audiences joined us for every concert, topping 300 for *America the Beautiful* on July 3 for our Independence Day celebration. Symphony's patriotic concert included a surprise treat: free ice cream!

PASSING TONES —

Measures of influence

William Klug, 92, of Ellison Bay and Fort Meyers, FL, passed away April 29, 2021, after bravely fighting an 18-month battle with cancer. Birch Creek lost a truly gentle man who served on the Birch Creek Board of Trustees (2005-2011), guiding marketing and fundraising committees during those years. Bill's natural ability to inspire others was essential to the success of the Capital Campaign of 2008.



Bill Guenzel, philanthropist, humorist, artisan, historian, and appreciator of the full worth of the Door County community died May 7 at the age of 74. For many years, Bill, with his wife, Jo, underwrote *Artists in the Schools*, Birch Creek's outreach clinic held each year for Door County music students. Long before that time, Bill was a member of a group of tradesmen that formed Great

Northern Construction, the company that laid the groundwork for remodeling the Tischler farmstead to serve as home for Birch Creek Music Performance Center. His kindness, curiosity, and humble spirit remain at Birch Creek alongside the stage's timbers and among the students performing there 46 years after.
