Fred Mann, One of Birch Creek's most trusted friends, Fred Mann of Sister Bay and Fort Lauderdale, FL, passed away in Florida on July 31, 2022. Fred treasured his summer home in Door County and the time he spent at Birch Creek where he and his partner, Charlie Beasley, were actively involved. Fred was a member of the Board of Trustees from Oct. 2011 through Sept. 2014, serving as Vice-President from Oct. 2013 through Sept. 2014; as an officer, Fred was also a member of the Executive Committee. His quiet influence extended across other committee memberships including Finance, Building and Grounds, Budget, and Marketing. In those years, Fred made a significant impact on the overall well-being of the organization. His warm personality and quiet demeanor left a lasting impression on the leaders who guide the Birch Creek music community.
