The **Jazz Program** offers students a unique learning experience at levels of jazz performance not found in most other jazz programs in America. Our program gives students an effective combination of experiences to help them master the fundamentals of jazz while establishing professional attributes. This includes top-flight instruction during the day, and hearing instructors perform in the Birch Creek Jazz Orchestra at night.

Areas of Study

- **Instrumental Technique** – Classes are given by master teachers three times per week and cover the fundamentals of effective playing skills and efficient practice.
- **Jazz Combo** – Classes cover music theory and improvisation skills, basic to advanced, in a performance-based ensemble.
- **Large Ensembles** – Student Big Bands are directed by outstanding professional educators. Ensembles rehearse daily and perform regularly during the evening concerts.
- **Ambassador Combo** – Made up of advanced students and serves as Birch Creek’s liaison to the community. “The Ambassadors” perform widely throughout Door County and are featured on many campus concerts. Audition required.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Completed applications will be reviewed for acceptance on a rolling basis beginning on FEBRUARY 1.

Applications will continue to be reviewed throughout the spring and early summer. Scholarships will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Apply early as many instrument positions fill quickly. If an instrument position is filled, you will be placed on a waiting list as cancellations do occur.

ADMISSION APPLICATION

1. SUBMIT YOUR **ONLINE ADMISSION APPLICATION WITH \$100 DEPOSIT** (Refunded if not accepted to the program.)
2. HAVE YOUR TEACHER COMPLETE OUR **TEACHER RECOMMENDATION FORM** (Returning students are exempt.)
3. SUBMIT YOUR **AUDITION RECORDING** (within the Admission Application OR email YouTube links to registrar@birchcreek.org). Required for new Drummers only.
 - Two (2) pieces with a contrasting style.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

1. SUBMIT YOUR **SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FORM**
2. SUBMIT YOUR **AUDITION RECORDING** (within the Scholarship Application OR email YouTube links to registrar@birchcreek.org). Be sure to include your name, session and instrument.
 - Two (2) pieces with a contrasting tempo.

(New Drummers are exempt. The audition you submitted for the Admission Application will be used.)

POLICIES

REFUND POLICY – All requests to cancel enrollment must be made in writing. If cancellation is received 30 days prior to the start of the session, all money except the \$100 deposit will be refunded. Any cancellation made fewer than 30 days prior to the session will result in forfeiture of all money paid. If a student leaves during a session because of an illness or documented family emergency, a prorated refund will be given. If a student leaves for other reasons, the balance will not be refunded.
